Nancy Fitch Women's History Award

Amount: Varies

Established by: This scholarship was established by Dr. Nancy E. Fitch, a professor of European history, who wishes to encourage students to study women's history by using new teaching technologies.

Open to: This scholarship is open to any CSUF undergraduate or graduate student in any discipline or department.

Criteria: Interest in women's history ♦ Academic achievement ♦ Financial need

Application Procedure: 1) Complete the departmental application available in H-815F (preferred typed); 2) Detail your interest in women's history and describe your activities relating to women's history on the departmental application; 3) Provide two letters of recommendation from two CSUF faculty members of any discipline or department; and 4) Submit application materials to H-815F.

Leon and Annette Gilbert Study Abroad Scholarship

Amount: \$500 (two awards)

Established by: This scholarship was established and funded by Dr. Leon Gilbert and his wife Annette to assist students in meeting their educational expenses in a student program. Dr. Gilbert is a Professor Emeritus from the Modern Languages & Literature department. The recipients will be selected by a Humanities and Social Sciences (HSS) scholarship committee.

Open to: This scholarship is open to continuing HSS students who are pursuing an undergraduate or graduate degree and have been accepted to a California State University sponsored study abroad program.

Criteria: 2.5 GPA

Amount: \$500 (two awards)

Open to: This scholarship is open to continuing HSS students who have returned to school after raising a family, establishing a career, or having to overcome other personal obstacles.

Amount: \$500

Established by: This scholarship was established by the Alumni Association and the College of Humanities and Social Sciences (HSS) to assist students in meeting educational expenses while studying in a California State University (CSU) sponsored Study Abroad program. Five \$500 scholarships will be awarded; two scholarships for this summer term, one for the fall semester, and one for the spring semester.

Open to: This scholarship is open to currently enrolled undergraduate or graduate student enrolled at Cal State Fullerton's College of HSS who have been accepted to a CSU sponsored Study Abroad program.

Criteria: 2.5 GPA ♦ International leadership activities

Professor Schweitzer demonstrated a lifelong dedication to excellence in higher education.

Criteria: 3.0 GPA ♦ Leadership ♦ Co-curricular activities

Jorice Maag Local History Scholarship

Amount: \$800

Established by: This scholarship is funded by the Friends of the Fullerton Arboretum to encourage the study of California history with preference given to those interested in local history. History is defined as

the study of topics relating to the immediate area of the campus, Orange County and the surrounding areas, or of persons and institutions in these areas engaging in activities that promote, conserve and/or exhibit such history. The scholarship may not be awarded more than twice to the same individual.

Amount: Varies

Established by: Department of Afro-Ethnic Studies established two scholarships both of which honors students majoring in Afro-Ethnic Studies. Anthropology

Jenkins-Douglas-Gardner Award

Amount: up to \$1,000

Established by: This award commemorates three promising young archeologists, Ronald Douglas, Bruce Jenkins and Edward Gardner, whose lives were cut short in a tragic plane crash in 1981 while returning from the field.

Open to: This award is open to new and continuing Anthropology major or minor students who are pursuing an undergraduate or graduate degree.

Criteria: Proposal

Established by: This award was created by his family and friends to honor the memory of Dan Byrnes, former chief of Public Safety at Cal State Fullerton. Preference for the scholarship is given to criminal justice, political science or public administration majors.

Open to: This award is open to any currently enrolled undergraduate or graduate student who plans a career as a sworn officer in law enforcement and who will be enrolled full-time at CSUF for the next academic year. Past recipients are ineligible to apply.

Amount: \$500

Established by: This award was established by Hilda L. and Daniel C. Holloway in memory of their daughter, Kimberly Anne Holloway, 2002, a graduate of the Department of English, Comparative Literature and Linguistics. The scholarship will recognize a student for academic excellence and assist the winner to complete a baccalaureate degree in English, comparative literature or linguistics.

Amount: \$1,000 for students enrolled in 6-8 units and \$1,500 for students enrolled in 9 or more units (up to 8 awards)

Carmen Delphine Bayati Memorial Scholarship

Amount: \$500 - \$1,000

Established by: This scholarship is named for Carmen Delphine Bayati, a re-entry student who graduated in 1993 with a B.A. in history. The memorial scholarship was established in 1993 by her husband, Khatan, and her sister after Carmen's untimely death. Two to four awards may be given annually. The scholarship will be judged by the History Department Development Committee. For purposes of this scholarship, a reentry student is one who dropped out of or postponed undergraduate education for at least one full academic year. Applicant must have been enrolled at CSUF for at least two semesters prior to the spring semester in which the award is given. Must have completed a minimum of nine units of history at CSUF and must continue to be enrolled at CSUF for the next full academic year.

Open to: This scholarship is open to reentry undergraduate history majors.

Criteria: 2.0 GPA at CSUF ♦ Financial need ♦ Family/work situation

Application Procedure: 1) Complete the departmental application, available in the History Department, H 815F, (657) 278-3474; 2) Prepare a typed statement that details the reasons for dropping out or postponing your college education, demonstrated financial need, and family/work situation; and 3) Submit application materials to the History Department: Chair, Development Committee, H-815F.

Warren Beck Outstanding History Student Award

Amount: Varies

Established by: This scholarship is funded by the History Alumni Association to honor Dr. Warren Beck, member and former chair of the History Department faculty until his death in 1991. Winner of the CSUF Outstanding Professor Award, Professor Beck was a noted teacher and scholar. The award will be judged and given by the History Alumni Association for intrinsic interest in history, which could be manifested in professional activities such as projects, papers, and participation in historical activities. Preference is given to a student who intends to use history in a career or in preparation for a career.

Open to: This scholarship is open to CSUF graduating undergraduate history majors.

Criteria: High GPA ♦ Financial need ♦ History related activities at CSUF

Application Procedure: 1) Complete separate application, available in the History Department, H-815F, (657) 278-3474; 2) Obtain two letters of recommendation from CSUF History professors; and 3) Submit typed application to H-815F.

Application Deadline: March 15

Lawrence B. de Graaf Outstanding Graduate Student Award

Amount: \$500

Established by: This award is funded by the History Alumni Association. It honors Professor Lawrence B de Graaf, a founding member of the CSUF faculty, and dedicated teacher and advisor to students. The award will be judged for interest in history, which could be manifested in professional activities such as projects, papers, and participation in historical activities. Preference is given to a student who intends to use history in a career or in preparation for a career. The award will be judged and given by the History Alumni Association. The applicant should have taken a minimum of 12 units in history graduate classes at CSUF and have been enrolled in the CSUF history graduate program for at least one year.

Open to: This scholarship is open to continuing CSUF master's degree history majors who will continue to work toward the M.A. degree at CSUF the next academic year.
