WHAT COURSES SHOULD I REGISTER IN FOR FALL?

- **Returning students:** refer to your Titan Degree Audit and [major roadmaps](#).
- **New students:** check your welcome email from your college to see what they are offering in terms of orientation, advising, and registration workshops. Freshmen must complete their [GE Modules](#) to find what GE courses are appropriate. Transfer students are encouraged to do the [GE Overview](#). You can also refer to your major's [roadmaps](#) for more guidance.

HOW DO I REGISTER FOR COURSES?

WHEN DO I REGISTER FOR COURSES?

You can find your enrollment date by going to your Student Homepage, selecting “Manage Classes”, and then selecting “Enrollment Appointments”. Step by step instructions on accessing your Student Homepage can be found on page 34 of the [registration guide](#).

HOW DO I REMOVE A HOLD?

There are two types of holds you will generally encounter: one prevents registration, and one is purely informative. Please read the hold carefully to see if it affecting your enrollment. You can find steps on how to read holds [here](#).

If the hold is informative (the hold is telling you about your Math or English placement, for example), you do not need to have that removed before registering for courses.

The AAC cannot remove any advising holds placed by your major department. You will need to read the hold to figure out how to reach your major department to remove that hold.

HOW DO I FIND MY MATH/ENGLISH PLACEMENT?

New freshmen may need to know what English or Math course to take depending on their placement. You can find this information under your holds. Refer to [this guide](#) on how to find and read your holds.

WHAT IF I HAVE AP OR IB CREDITS COMING IN?

We generally advise students to avoid taking any courses in areas where they may receive AP or IB credit. Please refer to our [articulation agreement](#) to see what credits you may receive for various tests.
