## Writing Informative & Persuasive Essays

- ✓ Two most common types of essays, Informative & Persuasive
- ✓ Paragraph 1: Introduction
  - Hook
  - Thesis
  - Agenda
- ✓ Paragraph 2: Body Paragraph #1
  - Transition (presenting Main Idea #1)
  - Secondary Ideas and Supporting Details (4 E's)



### Writing Informative & Persuasive Essays

- ✓ The 4 E's will help you develop a paragraph.
  - Can you give an EXAMPLE of that?
  - Can you give an EXPERIENCE to illustrate that?
  - Can you EXPLAIN that further?
  - Can you give EVIDENCE to support that?



### Writing Informative & Persuasive Essays

#### ✓ Paragraph 3: Body Paragraph #2

- Transition (presenting Main Idea #2)
- Secondary Ideas and Supporting Details (4 E's)

#### ✓ Paragraph 4: Body Paragraph #3

- Transition (presenting Main Idea #3)
- Secondary Ideas and Supporting Details (4 E's)



### Writing Informative & Persuasive Essays

### ✓ Paragraph 5: Refutation (included in a persuasive essay)

- Transition (presenting opponents' argument)
- Refutation (presenting reasons and evidence to weaken opponent's argument)
- ✓ Paragraph 6: Conclusion
  - Summary or Echo
  - Restatement of Thesis



### Writing Informative & Persuasive Essays

#### ✓ Writing the Abstract

- Topic
- Hypothesis
- Method
- Findings
- Conclusion

\* Typically an abstract is no more than 250 words, one paragraph, and single spaced.
