5. Received prompt written or oral feedback from faculty on your academic performance			
6. Worked with faculty members on activities other than coursework (committees, orientation, student life activities, etc.)			
7. Had serious conversations with students of a different race or ethnicity than your own			
8. Had serious conversations with students who are very different from you in terms of their religious beliefs, political opinions, or personal values			
9. Used an electronic medium (listserv, chat room, Internet, instant messaging, etc.) to discuss or complete an assignment			
10. Practicum, internship, field experience, co-op experience, or clinical assignment

12. Participate in a learning community or some other formal program where students take two or more classes together
