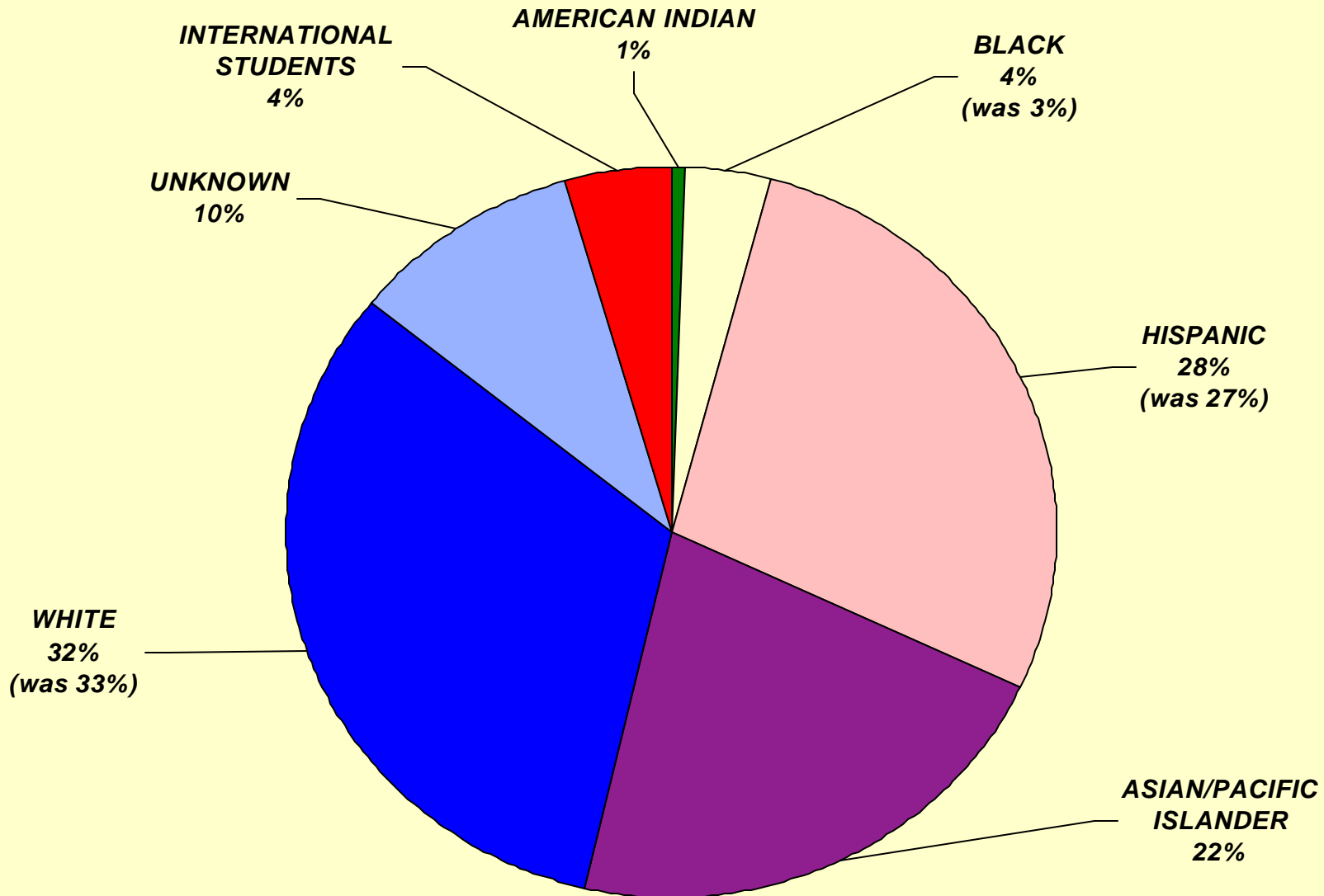

- 4,154 total students (303 more freshmen than last Fall)
- 60% women (no change)
- 64% under-represented (up from 63% last Fall)
- 97% full-time (no change)

- 38% from a high school in Orange County (up from 37% last Fall)
- 32% from Los Angeles County high schools (down from 33% last fall)

- Average age is 17.9, median age is 18, modal age is 18 (same as Fall 2006)

- 70% are proficient in Math (down from 71% last Fall)
- 51% are proficient in English (down from 55% last Fall)

- Average high school GPA – 3.18 (down from 3.19 last Fall)
- Average SAT score – 978 (down from 984 last Fall)

There are only six CSU campuses with a 2000 cohort graduation rate higher than Fullerton's, in rank order, SLO (67.0%), San Diego (58.3%), Chico (53.7%), Maritime (53.1%), Sonoma (50.8%), and Stanislaus (50.1%). All but Stanislaus have significantly higher SAT scores than Fullerton.

Trends in numbers of transfers follow the budget, in part. Recruitment of transfers into spring semester is sometimes modified to accommodate sudden budget cuts or increases (via earlier or later closure of applications.) Trends in percent share of transfers also varies by trends in size of freshman class. From 1998-99 to 2006-07, freshmen grew by 66% and transfers grew by 24%.

- 3,991 total students (112 more transfers than last Fall)
- 57% women (down from 58% last Fall)
- 51% under-represented (up from 50% last Fall)
- 68% full-time (no change)

- 58% from a college in Orange County (no change)
- 23% from Los Angeles County colleges (down from 24% last fall)

- Average age is 24.5, median age is 22, modal age is 21 (same as Fall 2006)

- 91% from community colleges (down from 92% last Fall)
- 97% have basic subjects completed (down from 98% last Fall)

- Average transfer GPA – 2.95 (down from 2.96 last Fall)
