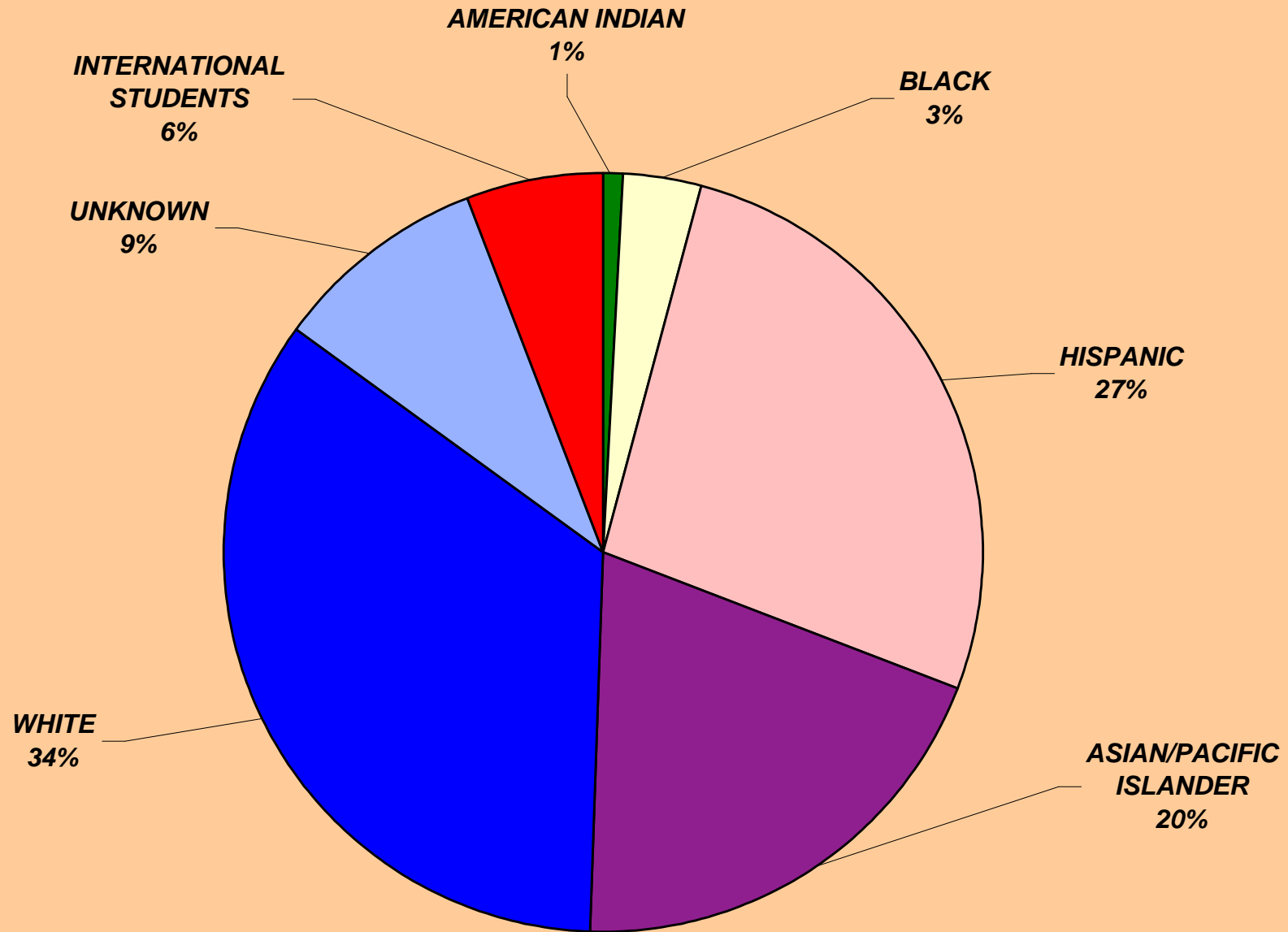

## *Fall, 2007 New Upper Division Transfers at CSUF* *(with Comparisons to Fall, 2006)*

- 3,991 total students (112 more transfers than last Fall)
- 57% women (down from 58% last Fall)
- 51% under-represented (up from 50% last Fall)
- 68% full-time (no change)
  
- 58% from a college in Orange County (no change)
- 23% from Los Angeles County colleges (down from 24% last fall)
  
- Average age is 24.5, median age is 22, modal age is 21 (same as Fall 2006)
  
- 91% from community colleges (down from 92% last Fall)
- 97% have basic subjects completed (down from 98% last Fall)
  
- Average transfer GPA – 2.95 (down from 2.96 last Fall)

**Total Credit Students:** Count of all the students who had a Headcount Status (STD7) of A,B,C,D or E at some time during the academic year

**Total Transfer Directed :** Students who enrolled in and earned a grade of "A", "B", "C" or "CR" in a transferable Mathematics course **and** a transferable English course sometime during the six-year period preceding the spring of the year

Transferable English courses were those with a Transfer Status (CB05) of "A" or "B" and a Course Program Code (CB03) of "150100" or "150300" or "150400" or "150700".

Transferable Mathematics courses were those with a Transfer Status (CB05) of "A" or "B" and a Course Program Code (CB03) that started with the value of "17" in the first two positions.

**Total Transfer Prepared :** All students who had earned at least the minimum number of transferable units with a minimum G.P.A of 2.00 as of the Spring term of the academic year

**Model Transfer Ready :** Students who were Transfer Directed **and** had earned at least the minimum number of transferable units with a minimum 2.00 G.P.A. as of the Spring term of the academic year.

Work done at all schools attended by a student was taken into consideration if an SSN was reported for the student.

If a student was counted as being either Transfer Directed, Transfer Prepared, or Transfer Ready in a prior year, they are not counted in the same category in this report. Only those students who attain a particular status in this year are counted.
