ADDITIONAL CHARACTERISTICS FROM RECENT SURVEYS AND OTHER SPECIAL STUDIES:

- 28% originally came from other countries (13% permanent residents; 4% International/student visas; 11% naturalized citizens)
- 19% come from families in which neither parent had any college. For Chicano students, this figure is 49%.
- 45% come from families in which neither parent graduated from college.
- 38% take classes daytime only, 21% night only, and 41% take classes during both day and night hours.
- 65% of lower division students are employed, averaging 20.5 hours of work per week. 79% of upper division students are employed, averaging 30.7 hours of work per week. 76% of graduate students are employed, averaging 34.5 hours of work per week.
- 12% of students are working two or more jobs simultaneously.
- 10% of students are not currently employed but are looking for work.
- 21% of students have one or more dependents.
- 63% of students commute from home or work to CSUF in less than 30 minutes.
