Before I was a board member I remember a luncheon at the Ebell Club on Laguna Road. As I recall the food was prepared by the board members and Rod Gilfry, a senior at the College of the Arts and now a world-renowned opera singer was our entertainment. He was sensational. About 70-80 members attended.

Later when I was a board member Deborah Voight, a senior music student performed at our luncheon in 1984. The Metropolitan Opera invited her to audition. She needed suitable clothing for the event, so Music Associates allocated the money to have an outfit tailor-made for her.

At first the College of the Arts sometimes requested funds for other needs of the Music Department, but during Dean Jerry Samuelson's tenure we established music scholarships as our only focus.

Since then we have grown considerably and we thought you might be interested in some of our early activities. Our first luncheon was held at the Ebell Club. The board members made a chicken salad and served cookies for dessert. At one of the following affairs we were entertained by Rod Gilfry a Senior at the Music Department who made his debut at the Met in'. 1996, and is now a world-renowned Opera singer.

After a few years our board member Katie Thorsen suggested we call our luncheon "Music and Magic" because her husband Dave, a member of the faculty at the Music Department, who. was also a Magician, was our entertainment. Soon we moved the event to the Marriott Hotel and then in the early 2000's to the Coyote Hills Golf Club.

Our attendance has grown every year and we are entertained each time by the winners of the music competition we sponsor. Our organization now is able to contribute \$40,000to \$50,000 each year for music student scholarships. Quite a success story!
