concert attendance, as well as learning about and participating in house and stage management, publicity and public relations, lighting and sound editing.

# Section 3: Preliminary Single Subject Credential Program in Music

Successful completion of this program leads to issuance of a preliminary teaching credential. These courses (including student teaching) are taken in the year following completion of the B. A. in Music Education and the SMPP (Sections 1 and 2 above). Students are required to apply for the credential program to the Secondary Education Department in February of the calendar year in which a student plans to student teach. Students also must successfully complete an interview and assessment in the April or May prior to student teaching. If one graduates prior to beginning the credential program, one must re-apply to the University as a post-baccalaureate student.
