

Navigating the U.S. Census Website to view Recent Data Released.

U.S. Census Home Page <http://www.census.gov/>

Note: The U.S. Census site often changes as the Census Bureau releases new information.

Pages may load slowly due to large amounts of traffic on website or level of geography chosen.

For quick access to Census 2000 or Census 1990 information

Census 2000 Summary File 1 (SF 1) 100-Percent Data

Summary File 1 presents counts and information [age, sex, race, Hispanic/Latino origin, household relationship, whether residence is owned or rented] collected from all people and housing units.

Census 2000 Summary File 2 (SF 2) 100-Percent Data

Population and housing characteristics iterated for many detailed race and Hispanic or Latino categories, and American Indian and Alaska Native tribes.

Census 2000 Summary File 3 (SF 3) - Sample Data

Summary File 3 presents detailed population and housing data (such as place of birth, education, employment status, income, value of housing unit, year structure built) collected from a 1-in-6 sample and weighted to represent the total population.

Census 2000 Summary File 4 (SF 4) - Sample Data

Summary File 4, like Summary File 3 presents information on the population and housing data collected on a sample basis from the Census 2000 long form questionnaire, as well as the topics from the short form 100-percent data (age, race, sex, Hispanic or Latino origin, tenure [whether a housing unit is owner- or renter-occupied], and vacancy status).

Census 2000 Redistricting Data (P.L. 94-171) Summary File

The Redistricting Data (P.L. 94-171) Summary File contains summary statistics on counts of the total population, for the population 18 years and over, for 63 racial categories, and for Hispanic or Latino origin.

Census 1990

1990 Summary Tape File 1 (STF 1) - 100-Percent data

Summary Tape File 1 (STF 1) contains 100% data on age, race, sex, marital status, Hispanic origin, household type and relationship, occupancy/vacancy status, tenure, units in structure, contract rent, meals included in rent, value, and number of rooms.

Summary Tape File 3 (STF 3) contains sample data weighted to represent total population for 34 population items and 27 housing items and 100-percent counts and unweighted sample counts for total persons and total housing units.

Note: Depending on which geographic unit chosen, selections for next step will be available on newly loaded page.

Select State.

Select one or more **geographic areas** and **click 'Add'**

To select multiple non-consecutive geographic choices at once, hold down the 'Ctrl' key while you click on an item.

Note: There will be a limit to the number of geographic areas allowed to be viewed at a time.

After **selecting** the areas, adding and **clicking NEXT**->

A new page will load. It will be titled **Detailed Tables-> Select Tables**

Select one or more tables and **click 'ADD'**
