Attendees: 62 / Evaluations: 39 = Response Rate: 63%

RESULTS

A majority of respondents (87%) found the forum useful or very useful for increasing their understanding of the state of assessment on campus, and 82% indicated that the forum was effective in increasing their knowledge of assessment practices.
