- Non-resident students must add \$372.00 to their basic registration fees for each unit of credit they take.

Payment Due Date

- Titan II Registration (August 4 – 21):
 - Registration online (via student portal access) allows you to register for classes first, and then the payment is **due immediately** on the same day of registration or the student will be subject to disenrollment. Payments via web are due by 11:30pm on the given due date. In-person and mail-in payments are due by 5:00pm on the given due date.

Payment Options	Notes
Credit Cards (available only on the Web)	MasterCard, American Express, or Discover only. VISA is no longer accepted. A 2.9% non-refundable credit card processing fee will be charged on all transactions made online.
ATM/Debit Cards on the Web (with MasterCard credit symbol only)	ATM/Debit cards will be processed as credit cards transactions. A 2.9% non refundable credit card processing fee will be charged. Debit cards w/ VISA will no longer be accepted.
Personal Checks on the Web (E-Check)	No convenience fee will be charged. Will be subtracted from checking account within 1-2 days.

Personal Checks	Make payable to CSU Fullerton. Write student name and CWID on the check
Cashier's Check or Money Order or Traveler's Check	Make payable to CSU Fullerton. Write student name and CWID on the cashier's check, money order, or traveler's check.
ATM/Debit Cards	ATM/Debit Card with PIN is available to use in person only at Student Financial Services - University Hall 180. ATM/Debit Card have a daily limit which may vary depending on the issuing bank.
Cash	Must be paid in person at Student Financial Services only - University Hall 180

Installment Payment Plan (IPP)

- Designed to give students the opportunity to pay their registration fees or non-resident tuition over an extended period of time
- Students 18 years of age and over, may apply for the IPP immediately after they register on Titan Online.
- **During Titan II payment #1 is due immediately on the same day of registration.**
- Resident students must pay a \$33 nonrefundable processing fee.
- Non-resident students must pay a nonrefundable 15% service charge.

Financial Aid

- Financial aid is available to students (dependant on eligibility) in the following forms:
 - grants** – financial aid that does not have to be paid back.
 - work study** – allows you to earn money for your education.
 - loans** – allows you to borrow money for your education.
Must repay loans, with interest.
 - scholarships** – generally does not have to be paid back.
- Eligibility is first determined by the completion of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

Federal Student Loan & Credit Cards

- Credit cards typically have higher interest rates for students.
- Federal student loans are supported by the federal government. Usually have lower interest rates, offer attractive repayment terms, benefits and options.

Federal Student Loan vs. Credit Cards

- Standard Stafford Loan with a fixed 6.8% interest*

Example: $\$10,000 \times 0.068 = \680 Interest

Total Debt: $\$10,000 + \$680 = \$10,680$

- Some credit cards will offer an interest rate of up to 25%**

Example: $\$10,000 \times 0.25 = \$2,500$ Interest

Total Debt: $\$10,000 + \$2,500 = \$12,500$
