Dr. Stoller, a member of the Management Science Department since 1970, passed away October 9, 1990. He is survived by his wife, Frances, whom he married in 1943, two sons and a daughter.

David's early career was spent with Rand Corporation from 1953 to 1966. His expertise was in Operations Research and he was in the forefront as this new field developed during the 1950s. Among his special assignments while at Rand were overseas duties in Rome and Athens with NATO. From 1966 to 1969, Dave was with the U.S. Department of Education in Washington. He was the author of two textbooks and many journal articles in Operations Research.

From the time he joined CSUF in 1970, Dave was one of the leaders in our department. He served as chair from 1971-75 and recruited many of our current faculty. He played an important role in curriculum development, especially the creation of the M.S. in Management Science. An unusual feature of Dave's career at CSUF is that he was pressed into service as Department Chair a second time, from 1984-96, an indication for the respect his colleagues had for him.
