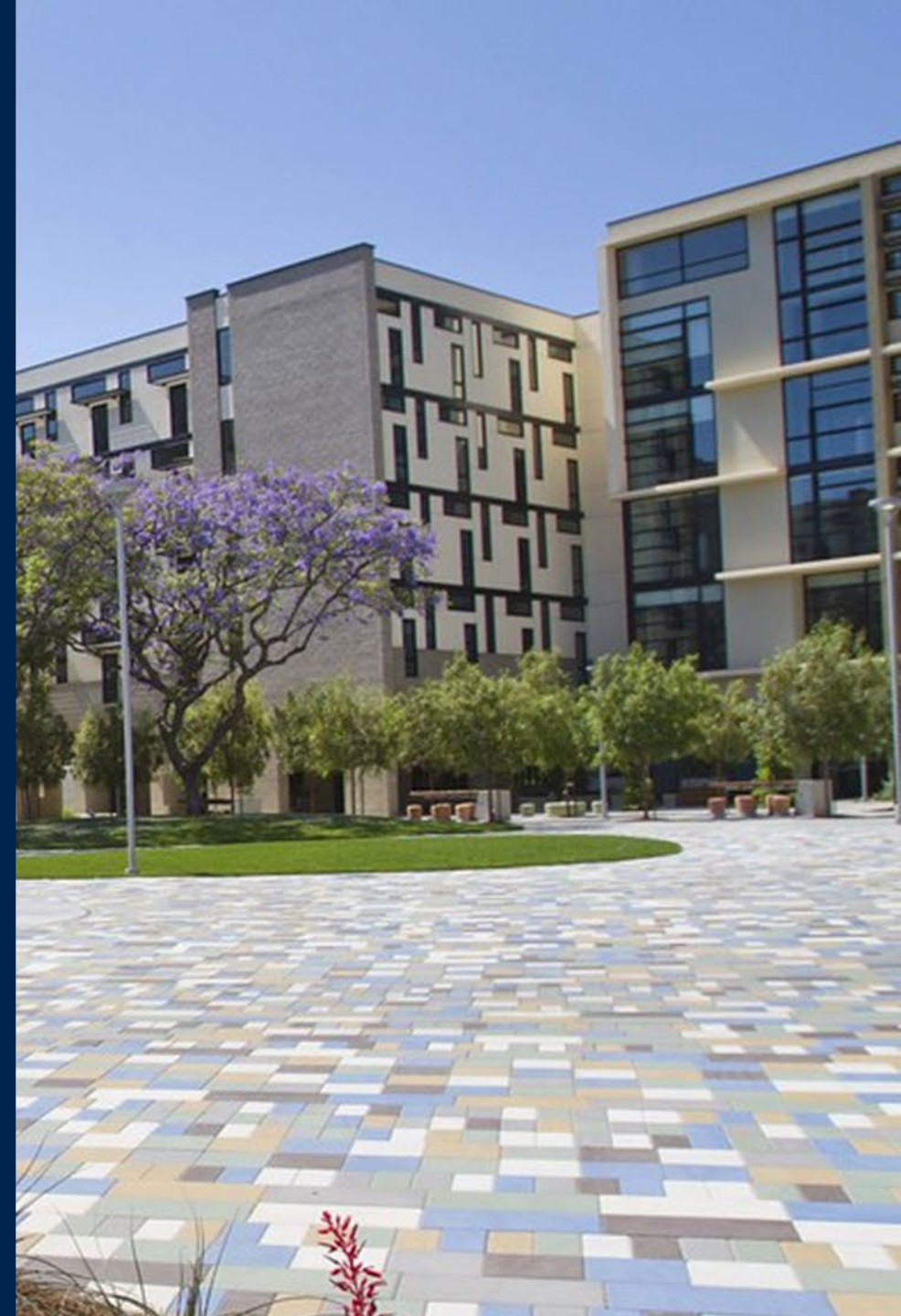

What is a Pre-Application?

- Pre-Application Opens Monday, April 8, at 9 a.m. PST.
 - Applicants won't be able to pay the \$50 application fee or officially submit your application until May.
 - **Applicants Eligible for the Suites or Apartments** (Transfers, Sophomores, Juniors, Seniors, Graduate Students and Students Ages 20+) can begin submitting their applications on **Monday, May 6, 2024 at 9 AM PST**
 - **Applicants Eligible for the Residence Halls** (Incoming First Year Students excluding transfer students and Students Ages 20+) can begin submitting their applications on **Wednesday, May 8, 2024 at 9 AM PST**
- Completing the pre-application phase doesn't guarantee you a spot in housing, nor does it count as submitting your full application.
 - So, there's no need to rush through it. We encourage you to take your time and fill it out thoroughly because applications won't be accepted until May.
- At Cal State Fullerton, student housing is allocated on a first-eligible, first-served basis. Therefore, by starting the pre-application early, you have the chance to get most of it done ahead of time, saving you time when it comes to submitting your application in May.
 - "First-eligible, first-served" means that we take the earliest applicants of each classification and offer them a space in student housing.
 - First-year students are only eligible to live in the Residence Halls.
 - Sophomores, juniors, transfers and incoming first-years who are 20-21 are only eligible to live in the Suites.
 - Seniors, graduate students, and students who are 22+ are only eligible to live in the Apartments.
 - After classification (first-year student, sophomore, etc.), the single most important factor in determining if you will be assigned is the date we receive your application.
 - The earlier you apply, the greater the likelihood you will be offered a bedspace in student housing.

While Student Housing at Cal State Fullerton is still **first eligible, first served**, applicants will be unable to finish the final steps and submit their applications until the applications officially open.

Financial Literacy

Understanding the Cost of Living On Campus

Choosing to live on campus at Cal State Fullerton is a decision that carries significant financial impact, so we require all students applying to read about the obligation that they're signing up for.

Types of Housing

Students will only be eligible for a specific room type based on their class standing, as follows:

- The Residence Halls are reserved for incoming first-year students.
- The Suites are reserved for sophomore, junior, and transfer students.
- The Apartments are reserved for senior and graduate level students.

These are subject to change based on availability.

During the room selection process, students will be able to see the room types that they are eligible for. Visit [our Housing Communities page](#) for more information.

Types of Housing Fees

For students living on campus, the cost of their stay is broken up into two types of fees:

Mandatory Fees: Room and Board

The primary cost of living on campus is made up of two fees: **Room Fees** refer to the actual cost of the space, and **Board Fees** refer to the cost of a student's meal plan. **Meal plans are required for all residents**, with very limited exceptions, so both these fees are mandatory for a student living on campus.

Understanding the Cost of Living On Campus: How Payments Work

Any fees that we charge to a student are posted as a charge due on the student's account through [Student Business Services](#), who also handles accepting payments on our behalf. We don't accept any payments directly in our office.

For **mandatory housing fees** for students living on campus, we post the total amount for each semester on the student's account at once, and it automatically breaks into **three payment due dates**, rather than a traditional monthly rent.

As you can see in the table above, students will be expected to pay their total room and board fees for each semester during the first three months of the semester. Afterward, no payments are due for the remainder of the semester.

In the event that we charge a student one of the extra fees on the previous page, those charges will appear on the student's portal as due *immediately* and can be paid separately from Room and Board.

University Tuition and Fees

All students pay University Tuition and Fees. In order for a student to live on campus, they have to be a registered and matriculated CSUF student. University Tuition and Fees are **always** paid before Room and Board.

THE FAFSA PROCESS

We provide more than \$120 billion in grants, loans, and work-study funds each year to help pay for college or career school. To apply for this aid, you must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form. Also, many governments and many college and career schools use your FAFSA information to award you their aid.

DID YOU KNOW?
Some schools won't consider you for merit scholarships unless you have an income as reported on either federal or state aid. You can submit a FAFSA, or complete one more if you have your own income for federal aid.

RELEAS
The school is required to do things to help you. You might not get a loan if you are not a resident, but it might be a requirement for the school to help you.

PREPARING FOR THE FAFSA
The FAFSA process is quick and easier when you have a username and password called a FSA ID. If you haven't created information on your FAFSA, be or you will need to. We have FSA ID as well. Learn more about the FSA ID and how to create yours at [studentaid.gov/fid](#).

GATHER THIS INFORMATION
The FAFSA asks questions about you and your financials, so have the information below handy.

- Social Security number
- Your high school or college
- Federal tax return (or 1043)
- Student or parent income
- Cash savings and checking account balances
- Investments like IRAs or 529 plans

DON'T HAVE ALL YOUR INFO READY YET?
The FAFSA you can enter the FAFSA, you can be considered for aid. It's important to fill it out as soon as possible to meet school and state financial aid deadlines.

MEETING FINANCIAL AID DEADLINES

You may be able to receive and receive aid information and the free information you need to receive your aid. Visit [studentaid.gov](#) for more information.

PROCESSING THE FAFSA
After you submit your FAFSA, your information will be sent to the colleges and career schools you listed on the form.

PROCESS TIMELINE
You'll receive an email within a few days, telling you how your FAFSA was processed. That college or career school might request additional information from you. Make sure you respond by any deadline.

FIRST-TIME APPLICANTS
You'll receive an offer from each college or career school you applied to and listed on your FAFSA, telling the amount of aid you could receive at the school.
Review and compare your offers, and decide which school to attend based on the school's cost and how well the school suits your needs.

RENEWAL APPLICANTS
You'll receive an offer from your school telling the amount of aid you could receive at the school.

RECEIVING FINANCIAL AID
Normally, you'll receive your offer and information of your financial aid soon. Funding only as much as you really need.

Housing and Residential Engagement offers a variety of housing communities to our students. However, please note that only certain groups of students based on their class standing will be eligible for certain housing communities.

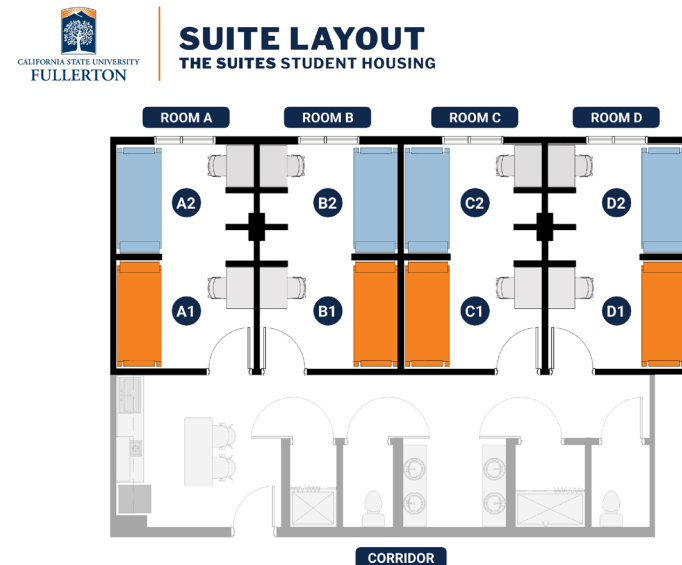
Our system indicates that you are a **sophomore, junior, or transfer student, or between 20-21 years old**, meaning you are eligible to live in the **Suites**.

If you believe this to be a mistake, please email housing@fullerton.edu as soon as possible so our team may review your case. While we review your case, please continue to fill out the application.

Each Suite will house eight students in an apartment with 4 bedrooms, 2 bathrooms, and a small kitchenette. Every floor will have three Active Rooms, common spaces for residents to socialize or study. Each Active Room includes a TV, an activity table, and plenty of lounge space.

The Titan Lounge is a community space for studying and socializing and leads to a laundry room and the outdoor courtyard. Additional spaces include a large multipurpose room that can seat up to 300 people, an additional mailroom, and new Residential Engagement staff offices.

Meal Plan

The following Meal Plan options are available to students living in the Apartments:

- **5 Day Continuous Meal Plan** with \$200 Residential Dining Dollars per semester - unlimited access to The Gastronome Monday through Friday during regular meal hours.
- **7 Day Continuous Meal Plan** with \$200 Residential Dining Dollars per semester - unlimited access to The Gastronome seven days each week during regular meal hours.
- **100 Block Meal Plan** with \$200 Residential Dining Dollars per semester - individual entrances to The Gastronome during a semester. Block meals may be used for any meal at any time during the semester.

Continuous Meal Plans allow students unlimited entries and to eat as much as they wish during their visits to our dining facility, The Gastronome. Block Meal Plans allow students a certain number of entrance credits to The Gastronome each semester. Once inside the facility, students with Block Meal Plans will be able to eat as much as they wish from all the different cuisine stations. After students have finished eating and are ready to leave, they may not return to the facility unless they use another entrance credit. Please note: block meals **do not roll over** from Fall to Spring Semester.

Each Meal Plan comes with a specified amount of Residential Dining Dollars. Residential Dining Dollars can be used for purchases in the Late Night Cafe or the Community Market. The Late Night Cafe is open until after midnight offering students a selection of hot entrées and snacks. The Community Market offers residents a location to purchase produce, snacks, and other necessities in the comfort of their living community. Residential Dining Dollars **do roll over** from Fall to Spring Semester.

Please note: The 100-Block Meal Plan is only an option for those in the Apartments. Students who select this plan on the application and are assigned to the Suites or Residence Halls will have their meal plan default to the 7-day Continuous plan.

Deadlines for Meal Plan Changes

All students living on campus at Cal State Fullerton will share space with other students. On the next page, you'll complete your Roommate Profile by answering a series of questions about yourself and your lifestyle. This information may be helpful to match you with the best potential roommate(s).

In June 2024, you will receive an email if you have been assigned a room selection timeslot. If assigned a timeslot, you will have a week to view suggested roommates or send roommate requests to specific roommates who were also assigned a room selection timeslot. **You will only see potential roommates of the same gender and classification who are also selected to live on campus.** If you opt into Gender Inclusive Housing, you will be able to view potential roommates of the same classification and any gender who are also selected to live on campus. Preferred roommates are not guaranteed! If you would like to be roommates with a specific student, please make sure that you both apply as soon as possible since room selection timeslots are assigned on a first-eligible, first-served basis.

Students who are not selected for room selection are placed in our waiting pool. If you are selected to be pulled from the waiting pool, you will be randomly assigned to an eligible bedspace and will not be able to request a specific roommate.

Reminder: This is a Pre-Application

Cal State Fullerton is now beginning a Pre-Application process. Applicants are welcome to take their time and thoroughly fill out the Academic Year 2024-2025 Housing Application.

While Student Housing at Cal State Fullerton is still **first-eligible, first-served**, applicants will be unable to finish the final steps and submit their applications until the applications officially open.

Due to the limited concurrent user capacity of our housing portal, we will be staggering the submission opening dates for first year students and other students, as the residence halls are reserved for first year students, the Suites are reserved for sophomore, junior, and transfer students, and the Apartments are reserved for senior and graduate students. First year students will be able to submit their applications on Wednesday, May 8th, at 9 AM PST. All other students will be able to submit their applications on Monday, May 6th, at 9AM PST.

There is no housing guarantee or live-on requirement at Cal State Fullerton, and we expect to be at **full capacity** for the 2024-2025 Academic Year. Applicants should apply as soon as possible for the greatest likelihood of being selected for Student Housing.

Immunizations Information

Immunizations offer safe and effective protection from vaccine-preventable diseases. The United States is experiencing re-emergence of these diseases, in part due to factors such as un-immunized and under-immunized persons and global travel. The American College Health Association (ACHA) strongly supports the use of vaccines to protect the health of our individual students and our campus communities. Before you start college, you should make sure that you are up-to-date on all immunizations including the following: **measles, mumps, rubella; tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis; varicella; and hepatitis B.** In addition, students living in on-campus housing are recommended to get the **meningococcal conjugate vaccine.** For additional information, please visit the Center for Disease Control and Prevention's website, www.cdc.gov or contact the Student Health and Counseling Center.

What you should know about meningococcal disease:

- Meningococcal (me-nin-je-kok-ul) disease is a serious illness caused by bacteria that can infect the blood or areas around the brain and spinal cord. Infection can lead to brain damage, disability, and rapid death.
- Meningitis is the most common form of meningococcal disease. Common symptoms of meningitis include stiff neck, headache, and high fever.
- College freshmen, particularly those who live in dorms, are more likely to get the disease. About 100 cases occur on U.S. college campuses each year, resulting in 5-15 deaths.
- Meningococcal vaccine can protect against four of the five most common groups of bacteria that cause meningococcal disease.

The meningococcal conjugate vaccine is recommended for college freshmen living in on-campus student housing.

Our Photo Waiver asks for your permission to allow Housing and Residential Engagement staff and student leaders to take your photo during our events and activities, where it may be later published on social media, our website and/or other printed media.

If you'd prefer not to be photographed, you can always ask the staff member taking photos not to include you in the photograph.

Release of Liability, Promise Not to Sue, Assumption of Risk and Agreement to Pay Claims

This agreement states that if you want to participate in the events and activities that Housing and Residential Engagement hosts throughout the year, you agree to be held liable for your actions and responsible for your safety, as described below.

Student Conduct Agreement for Events and Activities

Housing and Residential Engagement hosts a variety of events and activities to support and enhance your college experience. This agreement states that if you wish to participate in these events, you must follow the expectations listed below.

Housing Policies

Housing Policies

As members of the Housing and Residential Engagement community, as well as the academic community at California State University, Fullerton, individuals are expected to maintain a standard of conduct appropriate to their status as University students, per the Title 5 California Code of Regulations, Section 41301 Standards for Student Conduct. The policies in this document supplement Title 5 and students living in Student Housing are required to abide by both sets of policies. Residents are expected and required to follow all Housing & Residential Engagement policies as soon as they check in during the move-in process and take possession of their assigned living space on campus.

Living in a community requires an effort on the part of all residents to cooperate in respecting individual and group rights. Residents must abide by the rules and regulations which are designed to promote the spirit of cooperation that must exist to assure the safety and comfort of all community members. Violations of Housing and Residential Engagement policies may result in immediate cancellation of the Student Housing License Agreement, referral to the University Police and referral to the Dean of Students Office and/or Office of Student Conduct.

While policies are accurate at the time of publication, normal university policy-making procedures allow for changes to be made at any time. Student behavior that is inconsistent with the direction of Housing and Residential Engagement will be appropriately documented and addressed.

Student Housing COVID-19 Policies

Residents are expected and required to follow all Housing and Residential Engagement and University COVID-19 related policies as soon as they check-in during the move-in process and take possession of their assigned living space within student housing. The following policies supersede any inconsistent Housing and Residential Engagement policy for as long as these policies are in place.

FAILURE TO COMPLY Residents are expected to comply with all University policies, procedures, guidelines, and presidential directives, including without limitation those explicitly issued concerning the COVID-19 pandemic. Failure to comply with any COVID-19 directive or policy may result in student conduct proceedings within Housing and Residential Engagement including but not limited to eviction from student housing.

ISOLATION/QUARANTINE All residents are expected to comply with any directive from a University or county public health official requiring them to isolate and/or quarantine due to exposure or testing positive for COVID-19. Housing and Residential Engagement will work with residents who receive these directives to ensure they are able to comply. Due to the significant impact on the community's health and safety if these directives are not followed, residents who fail to comply with University and/or county public health official directives will be evicted from Student Housing.

Due to the limited self-isolation space available within student housing, COVID-19 positive residents will be asked to consider the following based on current guidance from the American College Health Association and CDC:

- Students who live near campus and/or have their own transportation will be asked to isolate at home/off-campus.
- Students who are positive may be placed together in identified rooms/locations for the isolation period.
- Students may be asked to isolate in place within their assigned rooms. In some cases, students who are in isolation within their assigned rooms might need to access communal restrooms that are also used by students who have not tested positive. In these settings, it will be important to minimize simultaneous use by multiple students and to maximize ventilation, distancing, and masking, with the understanding that masks will need to be removed for showering and oral hygiene.

PRESIDENT'S DIRECTIVE NO. 22 All residents are expected to comply with President's Directive No. 22 which governs all campus operations, expectations, and accountability measures related to COVID-19. The full text of the directive can be found here .

These policies are subject to change at any time based on need and guidance from local, state, and federal health agencies. Any changes will be communicated to residents via email in a timely manner. Student behavior that is inconsistent with these policies will be appropriately documented and addressed.

ACCESSORY TO MISCONDUCT Encouraging, permitting, or assisting another to participate in any act that could subject them to discipline is prohibited.

ALCOHOL Unsafe alcohol use and the resulting consequences have a significant negative impact on campus life and impair an individual's clarity of thought, verbal and perceptual acuity, and mental alertness. Members and guests of the community are expected to take responsibility for their drinking behavior and for the consequences of alcohol consumption. Individuals are strongly encouraged to call for medical assistance for themselves or others who may be dangerously intoxicated.

Eligible Age All residents and their guests must be 21 years of age to possess, consume, transport, or store alcohol. No person may manufacture, sell, furnish, or give any alcoholic beverage to a person under the age of 21.

Inability to Care The inability to exercise care for one's own safety or the safety of others due in whole or part to alcohol consumption is considered a violation of the alcohol policy.

Containers No one, regardless of age, may have an open container of alcohol (e.g., can, bottle, cup) in a public area at any time. A public place is anywhere other than a bedroom, suite, or apartment. Any alcohol containers, including those that are empty, are prohibited in any room in which a person under the age of 21 resides. Kegs (including those which are empty or untapped) or any item used to facilitate the rapid consumption or distribution of alcohol is not permitted, regardless of the resident's age.

Over 21 Those over the age of 21 may consume alcohol in the privacy of their bedrooms, suites, or apartments, provided that no unassigned minors are present in that room. This means that a 21-year-old resident who resides with minors may drink alcohol in their bedroom, suite, or apartment provided that there are no guests who are also minors.

Presence of Alcohol Anyone under the age of 21 who is present in any room to which they are not assigned, regardless of duration, where the consumption of alcoholic beverages is occurring and/or open containers of alcohol are present will be in violation of the alcohol policy. The Residence Halls are considered "dry", meaning that no person, regardless of age, may possess alcohol in these areas.

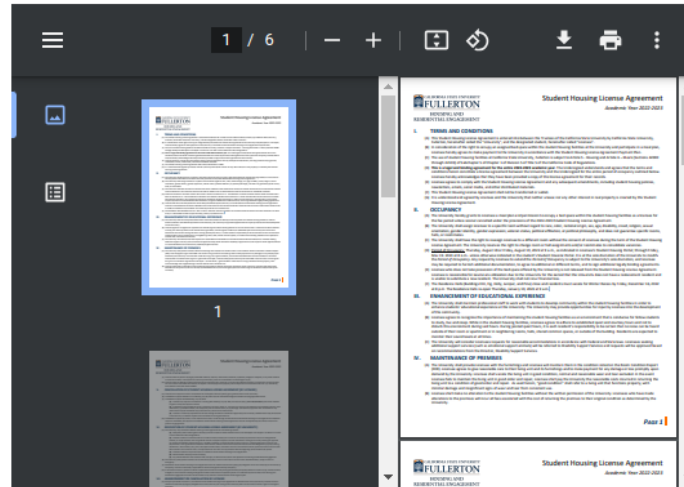
Public Intoxication Public intoxication by any resident or guest regardless of age is strictly forbidden.

ALTERATIONS Residents shall make no alterations or structural additions to student housing facilities. This includes, but is not limited to, chin-up bars being installed in any doorway including closets, mounted televisions, and shelves.

APPLIANCES In compliance with fire safety standards, electrical cooking appliances with external heating elements or that produce large amounts of steam are not permitted (i.e. toasters, coffee pots, rice cookers, grills, Instant Pots etc.). Space heaters and sun lamps are not permitted. The only microwaves approved in student rooms are those included in the "MicroFridge" (refrigerator/freezer/microwave) units rented by the approved campus vendor. "Microfridge" units must be plugged directly into the wall receptacle. Use of multi-plug adapters such as cube adapters, unfused plug strips, extension cords, or any other device not complying with the California Electrical Code are prohibited.

It is critical that students understand that this is a **legally binding** agreement, which means that once it is signed with the Campus Wide ID, and a student has been assigned a bed space, then a student is legally bound and is financially responsible for the space for the period of occupancy listed. We do offer an opportunity for students to cancel their housing application and assignment no questions asked via our portal. The deadline to do so is **July 16th at 11:55 P.M.** After the deadline students may request a cancellation via a license cancellation request. Please note that our staff carefully review each request and will only approve them if students meet the criteria for release. The University at its sole discretion can make the decision to approve or deny the requests.

At CSUF we also aim to prepare our students for off campus living and situations that they may encounter once they graduate from our institution. When students move off campus they will be asked to sign a lease when they rent their first apartment. Leases similar to our license agreement are legally binding agreements in which the individual will be financially responsible for the space for the term of occupancy. Therefore, it is important that you understand the responsibility you are undertaking when signing a legally binding agreement as off campus landlords will hold you financially responsible if you attempt to break your lease.

Note that signing the Student Housing License Agreement does not guarantee that you will be assigned a bed space.

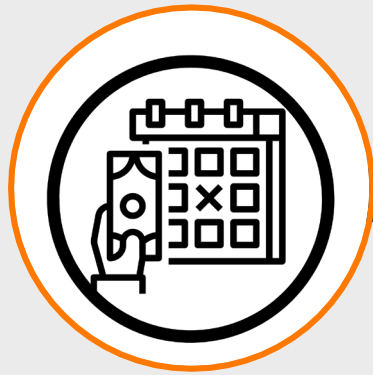

Roommate Process

- If assigned a room selection timeslot, applicants will have a week to view suggested roommates
 - Can see potential roommates who were also assigned a room selection timeslot, are the same gender identity (or opted into Gender Inclusive Housing) and are eligible for the same room type
- Residence Halls: 2-3 Roommates per Roommate Group
- Suites/Apartments: 2 Roommates per Roommate Group

Room Selection

- Sign onto the Housing Portal during their Assigned Timeslot and will be able to select their bedspace from a list of available bedspaces based on gender and classification
 - If in a roommate group, one roommate can pick bedspaces for all members of the roommate group
- Room Selection is Optional this year
 - Applicants who choose not to participate in Room Selection will be randomly assigned a bedspace based on their gender and classification
