New Equipment

We are pleased to announce that we are purchasing new equipment to assist faculty and students in the classrooms at Irvine Campus. This includes an audio system with microphone and speaker to enhance the instructor's voice in large classrooms. This will be available on a check-out basis. We will also use this system for small events that don't require a large audio system.

We are also installing new push-to-talk microphones in the two codec video classrooms. This will enable students at each table to be able to respond more quickly and easily to

the instructor teaching from Fullerton. We are also upgrading our Scantron equipment and software to the ParSCORE 6.5 version that is available through the Faculty Development Center at the Fullerton Campus. This will allow faculty to develop and manage student records and test information more extensively. As soon as the equipment arrives, we will have training available for faculty who want to use it. The FDC has excellent online resources and training available as well.

Air Conditioning

Everyone has been very patient with our continuing saga of air conditioning. We appreciate your patience very much! We currently have a large, temporary AC unit located in the back roadway. If you experience any heat related discomfort, please let Arlene know so we can call the contractor to remedy it. Once our new chiller is installed on the roof, the unit will be removed from the roadway and faculty/staff parking can resume in the back roadway.
