Dr. Bowman recognized the members of the task force who were present. The climate of a campus is a key factor for retaining faculty and staff and impacting effectiveness for student learning. Nationally recognized leader in campus climate surveys, Sue Rankin, has been retained for CSUF's first inclusive survey to mark a starting point for all sectors of the university. Effective framing of survey questions, complete anonymity, and involvement of all CSUF staff and faculty will be critical. Raw data will be available for any future research through IRB's proposal process. A written report from Rankin & Associates, done reflectively and accurately, will be received by A.S. August 2014.

The online survey will be available 3-12-14. It will be advertised extensively to faculty and staff requesting participation. In order to ensure complete anonymity, survey will need to be taken in one session – 15-30 minutes

14.1 ASD 13-152 Revised UPS 280.000 Intramural Research Grants [Source: FRC]

M/S (Bonney/Kanel) Motion to approve ASD 13-152, revised PS 280.000 returned from Research Committee for a second time. Senator Bonney itemized revisions. (Pasternack)

- Line 32: *friendly* amendment to correct name of *AVP Research* to <u>Associate Vice President of</u> <u>Research</u>, <u>Creative Activities and Technology Transfer</u>.
- Lines 42-44, D2: friendly amendment to add at the end of paragraph: "If a faculty member teaches in more than one college, he/she may select one of the colleges in which he/she teaches as the home college."

(Knutson Miller) Line 22: *friendly* amendment to remove comma after word *years* "...less than eight years, or are not full..."

M/S/P (Rhodes/Fitch) Lines 51-52, I-D-3: Motion to change percentages "....80% UFRC to 20% Colleges..." to "... <u>50</u>% UFRC to <u>50</u>% Colleges...."

VOTE (by Voice) motion passed with 1 abstention (Weismuller).

M/S/P (Fidalgo/Fitch) Line 42, I-D-2: Motion to remove from first sentence: or the college dean. Sentence will now read: "<u>Grant proposals are also reviewed by a college committee from the applicant's home college</u>." VOTE (by voice): Motion passed to remove words: or the college dean.

Back to main motion to approve ASD 13-152.

(Jarvis) further discussion is needed on grant eligibility criteria.
