I. CALL TO ORDER

Chair Stohs called the meeting to order at 11:30 AM.

II. URGENT BUSINESS

(Stohs) Yielded the floor to VP Kim. The Chief of Police Raymond Aguirre, Captain Scott Willey, and Ellen Treanor from Strategic Communications joined him to answer questions surrounding the rape incident that was initially reported to have taken place on campus yesterday.

(Chief of Police) The initial report was that the rape occurred in the Nutwood Parking Structure. Subsequent investigations determined it did not. We are in complete support of the student and understand that trauma sometimes results in initial misreporting. Our investigation is turned over to the O.C. Sheriff as the lead agency for crimes committed in unincorporated areas and contract cities, like Yorba Linda. We, as a campus community, continue to offer support to the survivor of this assault. In addition, we offer self-defense classes that will now be at no charge.

- Q: (Patton) Are the classes available to students?
- A: (Chief) Yes.
- Q: (Kanel) This is the second time announcements were made that were very scary. Students and parents are concerned if CSUF is a safe campus. Is it by law that you have to put detailed announcements out prior to full investigation?
- A: (Captain) Yes it is a federal law, the Clery Act. The Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act is a federal statute requiring colleges and universities participating in federal financial aid programs to maintain and disclose campus crime statistics and security information.

(Casem) On the twitter feed, there was a retweet about the alleged rape. Now that we have twitter on all our walls maybe we will be more cognizant of information that is tweeted.

- Q: (Baker) Students would like more security in parking structures and a plan of action. Have any students contacted you directly?
- A: (Chief) No students have reached out to me.
- (VP Kim) Before these events even occurred, one of our plans was to increase visibility around campus; more visibility in the evening and off hours. There are about 503 cameras on this campus, and we had a plan to replace some of the antiquated equipment and identify new areas that need security. Every year we conduct a night walk to measure the light on different parts of the campus and identify broken lights that need to be fixed. We will do it again this November.
- Q: (Bruschke) My spouse said when she went to campus they had an escort service, not by the police department. Do we have it?
- A: (Chief) Yes we are available to provide escorts to campus, we had 41 requests last night.
 - (Patton) I have had female graduate students that park off campus and that compounds the danger.
 - (Brown) The UPD can go a mile off the campus.

Q: (Matz) the help button in the elevators, where does it go if I press it?

A: (Chief) dispatch at the UPD.

Q: (Stohs) Is it possible for cameras to be installed in the elevators?

A: (Chief) It is possible and something we will consider in the future.

(Virjee) We had a student who was assaulted and our priority is to give her complete support of campus resources. It does not matter that the assault was off-campus. We are TITAN family and will offer whatever support she needs in the coming weeks.

• (Reneau) The Women's Center also provides a confidential advocate which is an additional support for anyone who does not want to file a police report.

Q: (Stohs) Is there a way for dealing with the media?

A: (Treanor) We have developed a new set of criteria in the last few weeks. We work with the media and are developing the trust so that they know they will get timely and accurate information from Strategic Communications. Some of the misinformation emanates from the media coming to campus and issuing reports. As we build rapport and trust, we expect there will be more accurate reporting.
