**RESOLUTION ENDORSING THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE ACADEMIC AFFAIRS/ACADEMIC  
SENATE JOINT TASK FORCE ON FACULTY RETENTION AND SUCCESS**

**October 21, 2010**

- WHEREAS: The Academic Affairs/Academic Senate retreat on August 17, 2010 focused on faculty retention and success; and
- WHEREAS: The Joint Task Force subsequently appointed by Acting Vice President Murray and the Academic Senate Executive Committee reviewed the white papers, discussion group reports, and suggestions of all working groups, and
- WHEREAS: The highest recommendation for recruiting and retaining faculty made by the Joint Task Force was to provide assigned time for faculty exhibiting high-quality scholarly/creative productivity and/or service, resulting in an effective teaching load of 3/3;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED: That the Academic Senate

- 1) thank the Joint Task Force members (Jon Brusckke, Angela Della Volpe, Jim Dietz, Shari McMahan, Chris Renne, Sean Walker) for their time and effort in reviewing the materials and preparing their report;
- 2) strongly endorse all recommendations of the Joint Task Force, particularly the framework for achieving a 3/3 teaching load for tenured faculty engaged in scholarly/creative activities and/or service;
- 3) strongly encourage Acting Vice President for Academic Affairs Murray to investigate implementation details of the Joint Task Force recommendations;
- 4) invite Acting Vice President Murray to provide an update on progress toward implementation of the Joint Task Force recommendations at its December 2010 meeting;
- 5) distribute this resolution to the President's Administrative Board; the Planning, Resource, and Budget Committee; campus full-time faculty; and the ASI Board of Directors.
