



Resolution on Course Outlines and Syllabi from University Information Technology Committee

Whereas, course outlines and syllabi must be distributed to students at the beginning of each semester; and

Whereas, digital information technology when applied appropriately can provide improved access to outlines and syllabi to students with disabilities; and

Whereas, the Instructional Materials Accessibility Plan includes: “A strategy to increase faculty use of the campus learning management system (LMS) for delivering technology-enabled courses, and for posting syllabi and instructional materials online for traditional face-to-face and hybrid or blended courses.”; and

Whereas, the cost and waste involved with traditional printing and photocopying of course outlines and syllabi can be minimized using digital information technology; and

Whereas, use of digital media facilitates academic continuity during and after an instructional disruption (e.g., disasters or campus emergencies) through the use of redundant, accessible systems; and

Whereas, the CSUF Information Technology Division provides access and support to the campus learning management system and other digital media alternatives (e.g., Titan Online, Campus Portal); therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Senate Information Technology Committee strongly encourages instructors to distribute course outlines and syllabi using the campus’ learning management system or other accessible electronic alternatives.
