## Resolution

## **Double Counting in Majors, Minors, and General Education**

**Whereas** there is confusion among faculty, staff and students as to what can and cannot be double-counted to fulfill degree requirements at California State University, Fullerton; and

Whereas current university policy statements do not give clear guidance on this issue; and

**Whereas** this lack of guidance has resulted in a number of exceptions to what was thought to be policy; and

**Whereas** requiring students to take additional courses to meet similar or identical learning goals has few tangible benefits; and

**Whereas** one of the purposes of general education is to allow students to explore different fields of inquiry; and

**Whereas** our current policies, exceptions to the rules, and the associated confusion creates additional bureaucratic hurdles that prevent or delay students from graduating and frustrate academic advisors; therefore be it

**Resolved** that the Academic Senate Executive Committee propose revisions to UPS 410.103 Curriculum Guidelines and Procedures: New Programs and/or propose a new UPS on double counting; and be it further

**Resolved** that the proposed policy should favor double-counting of major and general education units where practical, permissible, and advisable; and be it further

**Resolved** that the proposed policy be submitted to the University Curriculum Committee, General Education Committee, and Academic Standards Committee in September of 2014 for their review; and be it finally

**Resolved** that this resolution be forwarded to the President, the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs, and the Associate Vice President of Academic Programs at California State University, Fullerton.
