Abrego Future Scholars Program

Abrego students receive two-year scholarships and support services for historically underrepresented firstgeneration college students. The program aims to create and support leaders and role models by focusing on the core pillars of leadership, mentoring, community service, and academics.

Ballet Folklorico de CSUF

Founded in 2007, Ballet Folklorico de CSUF is a social and cultural blend of a dance troupe and a college organization. While having the opportunity to learn traditional and interpretive dances of Mexican folklore at a very low cost, students also have opportunities to volunteer, fundraise, and connect with their community through social events.

Latinx Community Resource Center

The Latinx Community Resource Center at CSUF hosts culturally relevant student engagement opportunities to create an inclusive environment that engages with history, culture and equity issues surrounding the Latinx community.

First-Generation College Student Week

First-Generation College Student Week provides programming, outreach, and resources to support underrepresented students who are the first in their families to attend college. With a focus on access and success, activities educate and empower students to navigate college and earn their degree.

Mariachi Titans

Mariachi Titans is the first-ever official mariachi club at Cal State Fullerton. Their mission is to introduce a cultural musical ensemble to the CSUF campus, while emphasizing the rich tapestry of Latino/Chicano culture. Mariachi Titans seeks to empower the Latino/Chicano community through uniting people, fostering a sense of community on campus, and providing a joyful connection to the cultural roots of all community members.

Educational Opportunity Program (EOP)

The CSUF EOP program offers preadmission counseling, admission assistance, referrals for tutorial learning, career guidance, financial aid advisement, and other student services for historically underrepresented and under-resourced students.
