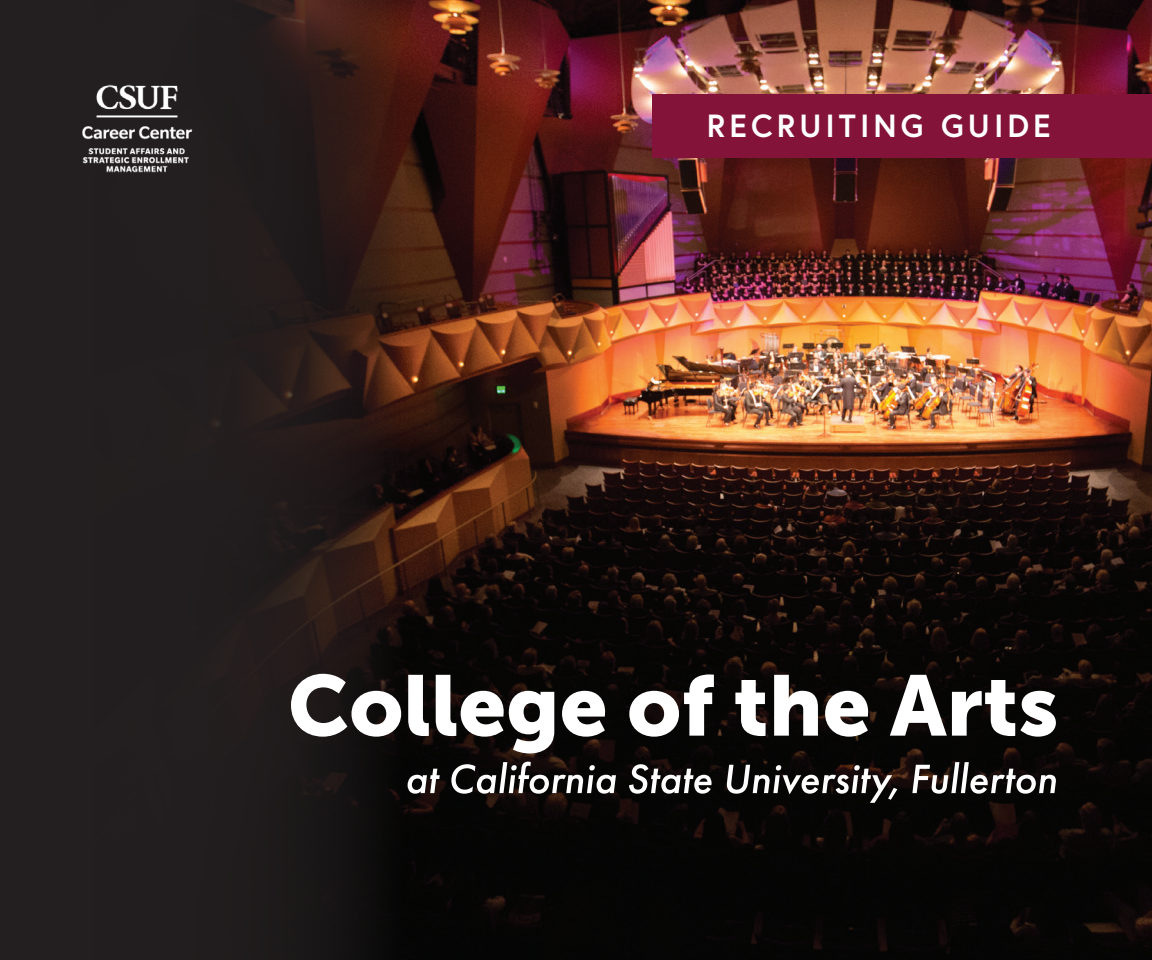

The College of the Arts develops career-ready creative professionals by combining rigorous training with sustained, real-world practice in visual arts, music, theatre, and dance. As a "living laboratory for the arts," students refine their craft through hands-on production experiences, like performances, concerts, exhibitions, masterclasses, and visiting artist lecture, building the portfolios, stage experience, and professional habits employers expect. The college emphasizes innovation and industry connection, with faculty who bring professional experience into the classroom and opportunities that place students in professional settings (e.g., showcases and internships) so graduates are prepared to contribute immediately in creative industries such as entertainment, design, and the performing arts.

How to recruit College of the Arts students

- Post internships and jobs in Titan Connection to reach College of the Arts students and recent grads
- Register for CSUF career fairs and recruiting events to meet arts students in person
- Host an employer info session to present your company, share creative roles, and network with students either in person or virtually
- Schedule interviews through On-Campus Interviewing (OCI) for internships and full-time creative roles
- Participate in the Titan Takeover one-day job shadow program to introduce students to creative roles at your organization

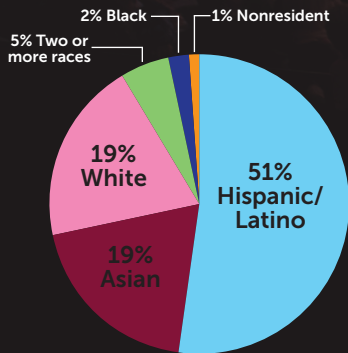

BFA Acting Expo

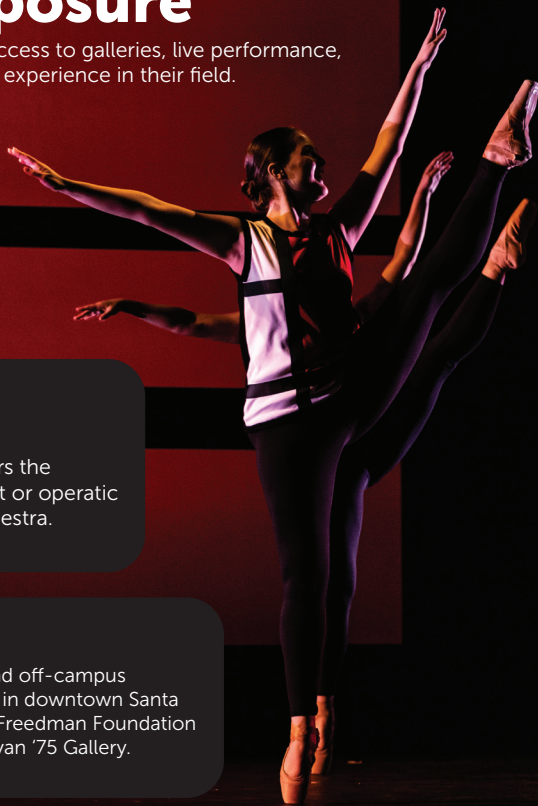
The CSUF BFA Acting Expo is an annual industry showcase where graduating acting students in the BFA program present their talent to industry professionals, casting directors, and agents.

In 2024, the College of the Arts completed construction of a cutting-edge visual arts complex, which includes four gallery spaces, renovated classrooms for digital art concentrations, graduate art studios, upgraded lecture halls; new faculty offices; indoor and outdoor seating; and state-of-art studio facilities such as a green screen/motion capture room, a photography wing, a digital fabrication lab, and a drawing and painting room.
