### **Orange County Projections 2022 (OCP-2022):**

This dataset contains Orange County, California housing, population, and employment projections in five-year intervals up to 2050. Data is shown by County, 2021 Jurisdiction, Regional Statistical Area (RSA), Community Analysis Area (CAA), and 2020 Census tract. OCP-2022 was approved by the Orange County Council of Governments on September 22, 2022. Data and assumptions are as of September 2022.

Information is released in aggregate form at the city level; free to download.
