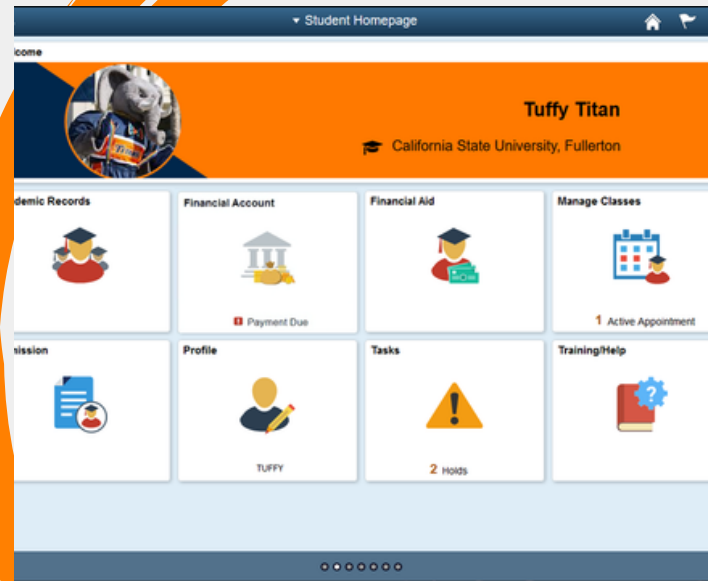

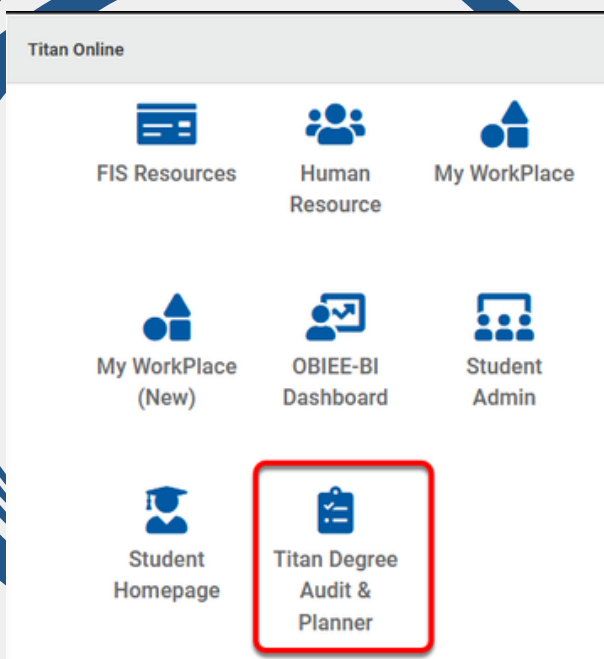


Titan Degree Audit (TDA)

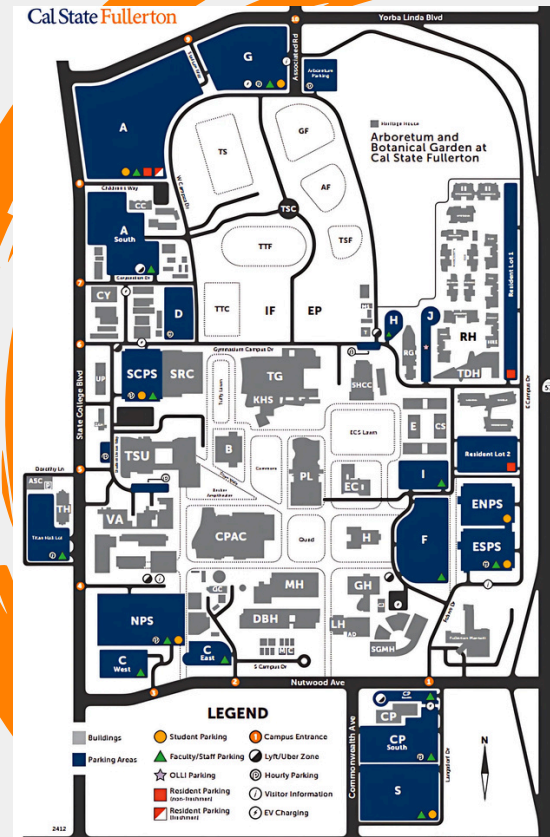

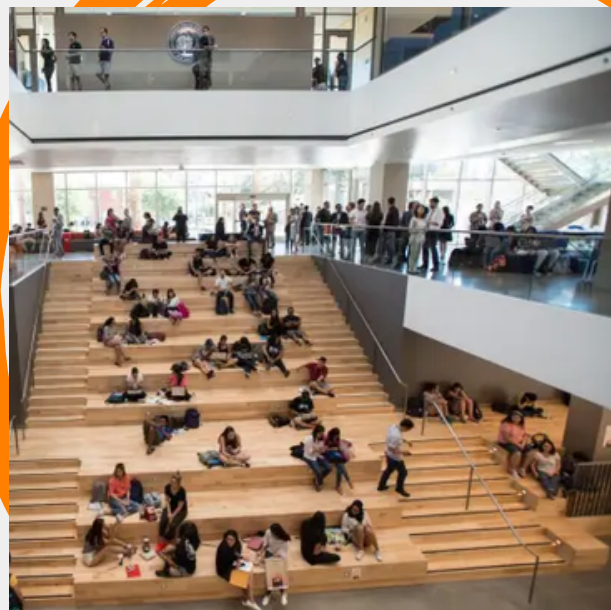


TSU
