Join SMDEP for a FREE six-week summer enrichment program. This program is for college freshman and sophomore students who are interested in the fields of medicine or dentistry. Join us at one of 12 sites around the country, featuring:

- Academic Enrichment in the Basic Sciences and Math

- Learning Skills Workshop or Sessions
- Exposure to Clinical Settings
- Workshops in Financial Planning and Health Policy

#### To be eligible for SMDEP, an applicant must:

- Be a college freshman or sophomore.
- Have an overall GPA of 2.5.
- Be a U.S. Citizen or hold a permanent resident visa.



Other factors that are considered include that a student:

- Identifies with a group that is racially/ ethnically underrepresented in medicine or dentistry (as defined by each site);
- comes from an economically or educationally disadvantaged background;
- and has demonstrated an interest in issues affecting underserved populations.
