VII. CHAIR'S REPORT - written report distributed on 3-20-18.

I want to start this report by thanking everyone for their work during the last Senate meeting. We completed two important items of work and did so in a manner that highlighted how shared governance works. We passed the Constitutional fix to the election process and are ready to move forward with the Spring 2018 elections. Although unrelated to these particular reforms, our Spring election season is already underway with voting for a member of our Statewide Senate delegation this week. Good luck to all the candidates on the ballot for this important position.

In addition to the Constitutional fix, we also completed a long discussion and debate about the procedural revisions to UPS 210 as proposed by the Faculty Affairs Committee. Thanks to the work everyone did on this and especially the members of the Faculty Affairs Committee for making this document clearer and stronger. I look forward to our upcoming debates and discussions about other areas of 210 in later meetings.

For this Senate meeting, we have two major items. Both of the items are presentations but one is designed more as a working session with significant and immediate feedback provided from the members of the Senate. We will start with a short presentation about changes to the commencement exercises this year. We will then move to a working session on the first full draft of the University Strategic Plan. After receiving input from the campus, the Strategic Plan Task Force put together an initial draft of the proposed plan for the next five years. This step is to receive input on a draft before that draft becomes final.

This dialogue and consultation is important. Strategic Plans help guide the university and university resources over the next several years. Therefore, this working session is an important opportunity for the group to hear from the collective voices of the Academic Senate on the concepts, goals, direction reflected in the plan. I hope all are ready to provide this important input to the Task Force so we can create a plan that represents the wishes of the people in our university.
