



CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT RESULT ALL-UNIVERSITY ELECTION - SPRING 2017

Faculty by petition proposed an amendment to the Constitution that would have eliminated the at-large seats. When this change was considered in the Academic Senate on 2-2-17 the proposal was amended to the form below, and when the Senators voted on the proposal on 2-16-17, 20 members voted YES, 18 members voted NO, and 2 abstained.

ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP Section 1. The Academic Senate shall consist of (1) the following ex officio members: the President of the University, the Vice President for Academic Affairs, the Immediate Past Chair of the Academic Senate (except in the case when the incumbent Chair is re-elected), the CSU Academic Senators, the President of the exclusive bargaining representative for Unit 3; (2) 35 full-time faculty members, of which 6 shall be at-large and 29 shall represent specific constituencies, all of which shall be elected by the Academic Senate electorate according to the procedures set forth in the Bylaws; (3) two part-time faculty members elected by the part-time faculty according to the procedures set forth in the Bylaws; (4) two students appointed by Associated Students, Inc.; (5) two staff members elected by the staff according to the procedures set forth in the Bylaws and (6) a member appointed by the Emeritus Professors of California State University, Fullerton.

Shall this amendment be adopted?

NO – 200 votes

YES – 530 votes – PASSED
