CHAPTER EDUCATION & SAFETY

BECOMING A MEMBER: CSUF'S APPROACH TO TRAINING NEW FSL CHAPTER MEMBERS

In fall 2022, FSL implemented a new member orientation training, entitled "B.A.M: Becoming a Member" (BAM). BAM is hosted at least three times in both fall and spring semesters and is designed for students who are participating in the new member process for an FSL chapter. FSL collaborates with campus partners to deliver the presentations at BAM. The required sessions include content on Alcohol and Other Drugs, Title IX, Hazing Prevention, and Well-Being.

Alcohol & Other Drugs

Campus Partner: TitanWell

Using a harm-reduction approach to alcohol use, the "Titan Up the Party" presentation by the TitanWell department addresses the basics of alcohol consumptions. The presentation includes information on standard drink size, blood alcohol concentration (BAC), binge drinking behaviors, Good Samaritan law, and how to recognize the signs of alcohol poisoning.

Title IX

Campus Partner: Title IX and Gender Equity

In partnering with the Title IX and Gender Equity department, students learn about their rights and responsibilities such as affirmative consent, campus reporting options, and campus resources.

Hazing Prevention

Fraternity and Sorority Life

Hazing Prevention provides new members with an opportunity to learn how hazing can be exhibited, and different types of hazing, and also uses case studies to provide realistic scenarios of hazing cases that have occurred. Students are asked to identify types and levels of hazing, ways to intervene, and campus reporting options. CSU policies and California hazing laws are also covered in this workshop.

Well-Being & Community Culture

Fraternity and Sorority Life

In Fall 2022 B.A.M. included a presentation entitled "B.R.O. Code" for fraternity members. "Brotherhood Reimagined for Organizations" was created by CSUF staff and fraternity members to promote positive images of masculinity, violence prevention, and increasing help-seeking behavior among chapter members. Sorority members, participated in an empowerment session that focused on community building, uplifting one another, and growth with confidence.





- In collaboration with the Title IX and Gender Equity department, we enforce the completion of the Title IX training for returning students.

IFC Cup 2022

AFLV West Conference 2023

Executive Board members from IFC, MGC, and Panhellenic Council represented Cal State Fullerton at the 2023 AFLV West Conference.

AFLV (Association of Fraternal Leadership & Values) exists to accelerate progress in fraternity/sorority communities through change-enabling experiences.

Our students were able to learn recruitment strategies, communication skills, and tools they can utilize in their executive roles.
