ACCEPTANCE OF TRANSFER CREDITS INLUDING MILITARY CREDIT

Undergraduate students who transfer into CSU Fullerton may be awarded credit for courses completed at other regionally accredited colleges and universities. Student must submit an official transcript from each institution where they completed courses. Transfer courses are applied toward degree requirements and are based on factors such as articulation agreements, unit limitation and General Education certification.

Cal State Fullerton grants undergraduate degree credit for successful completion of non-collegiate instruction, either military or civilian, appropriate to the baccalaureate degree, which has been recommended by the Commission on Educational Credit and Credentials of the American Council on Education. The numbers of units allowed are those recommended in the Guide to the Evaluation of Educational Experience in the Armed Services and the National Guide to Educational Credit for Training Programs.
